The full obituary will appear in the Tuesday edition of the Daily Herald-Tribune.

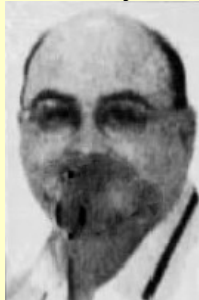
