V'ball Wolves hoping their dues are paid

They paid the price last season and now it's time to reap the rewards for the Grande Prairie Regional College men's volleyball team.

When coach Gordon Montford took a team of rookies into the Alberta Colleges Athletic Conference (ACAC) last year, he knew they'd be in tough. Tough it was as the Wolves lost more than they won and ended up out of the playoffs.

Now five of those rookies have a season under their belt and Montford figures it's time they made things tough on their opponents.

"We have a run at the roses if the athletes will pay the price," the ever-elocquent Montford predicts.

"You have to be aware, we have the ability, we have the height, and we have the depth."

Returning for the Wolves are local power-hitter Nelson Hartman along with Grant Livadney, Corey King, Mark Neid and Lee Surmak. Montford says he's also kept nine rookies around for the season, making for a very large squad.

"Maybe I'm being wimpy. I can only dress 12 for a match, but some of these guys are very, very close. All the guys have strong potential and I didn't have the heart to make a tough decision."

One first-year player who's in a battle for playing time is local product Shea Walker. Montford said he approached the Grande Prairie Composite High School product last winter, but got the impression Walker was bound for Calgary's Mount Royal College.

"I talked to him to some extent before Christmas and he let me know

what his intentions were then," Montford says.

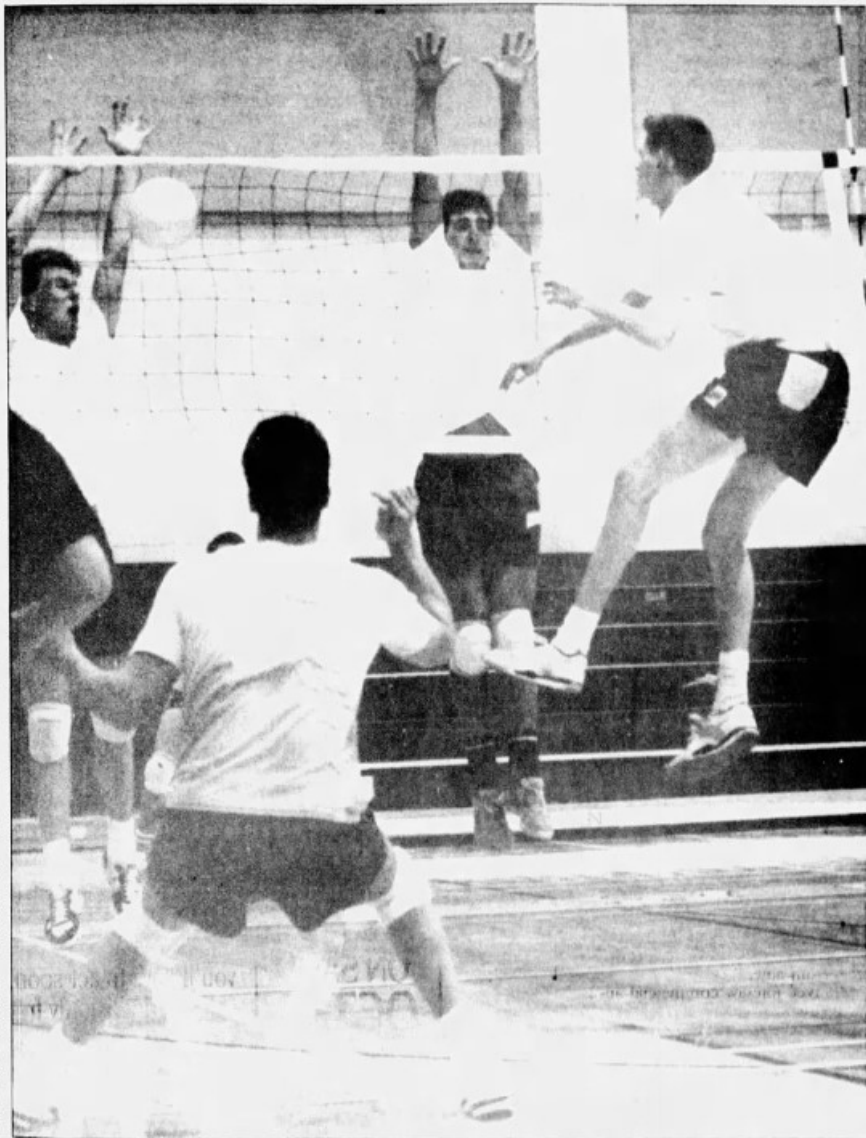
"He changed his mind and he's here."

A couple other rookies Montford figures might make an impact on the squad include Terrace, B.C.'s Jason Haldane, Fort St. John's Mike Sebold and Yellowknife's Rod Campbell. Haldane was initially recruited by the GPRC two years ago. Sebold has played a year at the University of Alberta and Campbell was a standout at the Arctic Winter Games.

"They may not get all the play they want, but it'll give them a year of development."

The Wolves ACAC season doesn't officially begin until October 26-27 when they're in Olds for a pre-season tournament. Their first regular season match is in Red Deer, November 10-11. They take on Keyano College from Fort McMurray in their home debut, November 16-17.

This Saturday the Wolves and Lady Wolves volleyball teams will be taking part in an alumni tournament in the college's new gymnasium. Montford says three men's teams and one women's team composed of former college players will be on hand to take on this year's edition of the Wolves. Spectators are invited to drop in on the action which gets underway at 1 p.m.

Alphabet maze



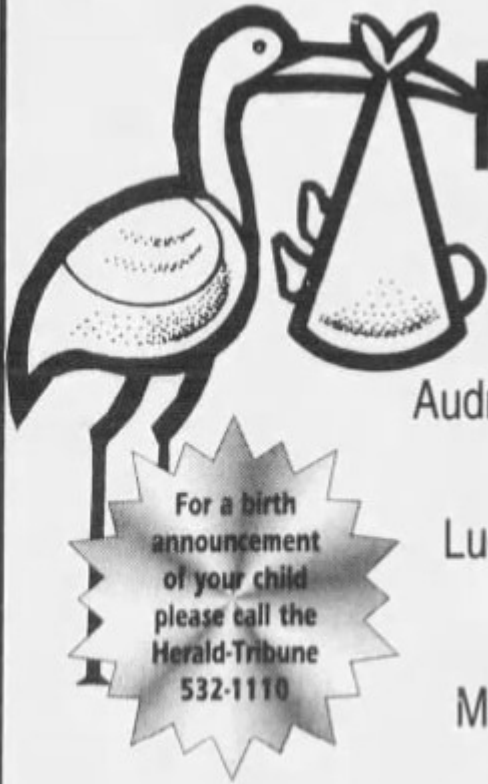

so I can be guided.

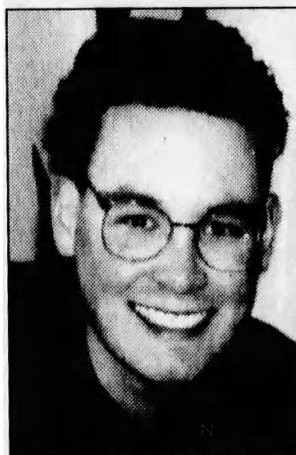

sad.

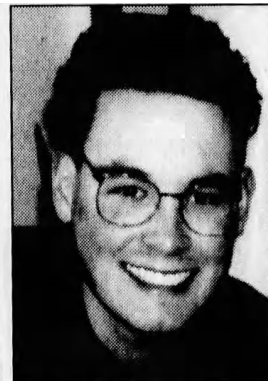
You were what most men strive to be,
