Linda Edlund of Grande Prairie passed away at the Q.E.II Hospital on December 20, 2002 with her family at her

bedside. She had suffered from M.S. for many years and was confined to a wheelchair for about seven years.

Linda was born in High River, Alberta, on October 23, 1951. She grew up on a farm at Nanton, Alberta, and at the age of 14 moved with her family to Grande Prairie in 1965.

After completing high school at the Grande Prairie Composite, she worked for a time at the local post office and became the first female letter-carrier in Alberta. Later on, Linda took a bookkeeping course at the Grande Prairie Regional College after which she began her own accounting business known as Linda's Bookkeeping Service. She carried on with the business until failing health prevented her from continuing.

Linda was married to Alfred Edlund in 1977.

She is survived by her husband Alfred, son Chris (Corri), daughter Kelly (Mike Ramsankar) and grandson Brett, sister Kendra (Casey), nephews Riley and Brady, two brothers Larry (Margaret) Muir of Clairmont, Bruce (Anne) Muir, nieces Lindsay and Kyla all of Duncan, B.C., her parents Bert and Dorothy Muir of Grande Prairie, as well as many uncles, aunts and cousins.

Linda enjoyed playing softball in earlier times and loved to meet her friends at the Legion on Friday after work.
