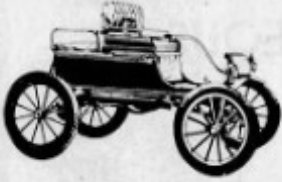

The Stark family emigrated from Scotland in 1926 and settled in the Bezanson district. Des was born on October 16, 1930 in Grande Prairie, Alta. His mother passed away when Des was three years old and he was raised by his father, grandfather, brother and sister and Mrs. Hazel Hunter. At the age of 15, Des spent his first winter logging and his summers as a farmhand. Des married Lorice Weegar on October 24, 1951. In the winter of 1954 Des suffered a severe logging accident. After spending a year recuperating, Des went to work for Jim Clarkson on his farm, where he discovered a love for planting seeds and watching them grow. In 1958 he purchased the Ott Patterson farm in Bezanson where he farmed until his retirement. Des raised pigs, milked cows and sold the cream to make a living. He particularly enjoyed raised his Black Angus cows until his health forced him to sell the cattle. Des loved to walk through the cows and call each one by name.

During his lifetime, Des' love for life was expressed in his commitment to Lorice, his children and grandchildren and his involvement in the community. He loved the simple things in life. His appreciation of watching nature's renewal through the seasons has been passed on to many of his children.

Funeral services will be held on Saturday, January 25, 2003 in the Bezanson Community Church at 2 p.m. Pastor Lew Wiegel officiating. Interment to take place at the Glen Leslie Cemetery. A luncheon will follow at the Bezanson Community Church. Public viewing at Oliver's Grande Prairie Funeral Chapel on Friday, January 24, 2003 at 8 p.m.. will join again.

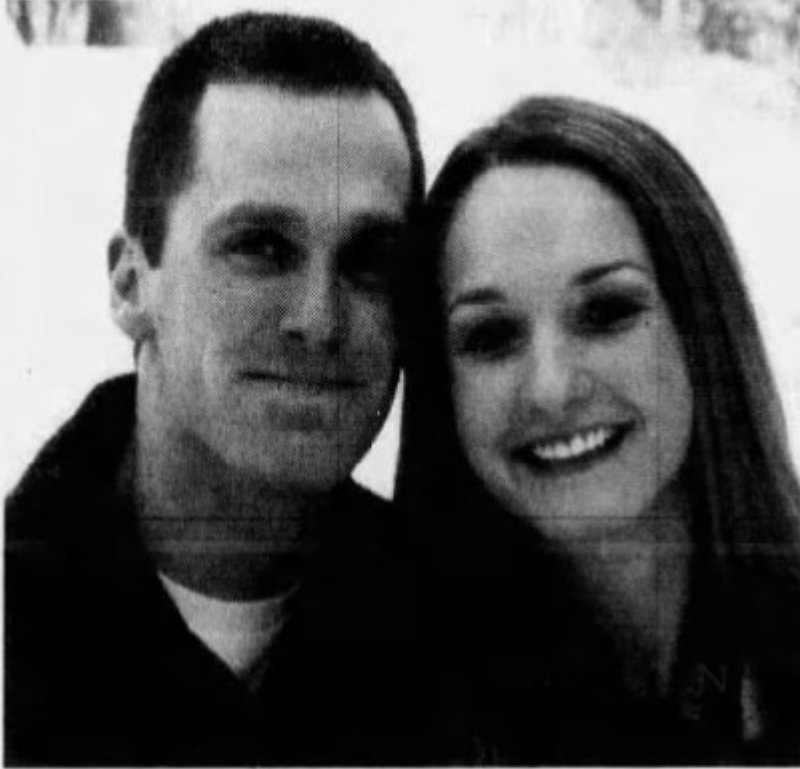
