## Official Opening Tomorrow Of Hillside Community Hall

The newest centennial project in Grande Prairie is a \$5000 arch-rib community hall on the city's east side.

It will be officially opened tomorrow by Mayor George Regka, who will strip a ribbon signifying the culmination of a five-year old dream of the Hillside Park Community Association.

The furnished hall was first

proposed in 1962, association president **Herb Stoeves** said today, and construction started last year. It was finished up in 1967 and includes washrooms, a furnace room and a divided main floor area.

The opening ceremony, to which the mayor has been invited, takes place at 1 p.m. and will be followed by coffee and donuts. Mr. Stoeves anticipates

The hall, besides being used for association events, will also serve Brownies, Guides, Cubs, Scouts and a possible play-school. The hall is not large enough to hold the regular association bingos which will continue in the nearby Hillside school.

Mr. Stoeves paid tribute to parks and recreation administrator Lew Johnson and his staff for assistance in erecting the hall, and to John Zimmerman and Brian McCurdy who volunteered labor.

Tissington Industries put up the shell of the structure, Bovelstoke supplied the doors, Dick's Plumbing put in the plumbing and Cookshaw Electric handled wiring.

across the pool.

A rooster pillow fight saw The Herald-Tribune's Dale Sazwan, Al Parsons and Bob Guenette oust the teams of Lorne McLeod, Tom Young, Jay Ray and Gary Merritt. CFGP competitors didn't show up.

The Peace River Regional Planning Commission won a hand-to-hand toilet plunger combat on the high seas against the Municipal Planning Commission as they sailed in their rubber dinghies across the pool.

However, in a challenge event the PRRPC lost bravely to the Grande Prairie fire department. Each vessel consisted of five gallant sailors.

The last of the events included a battle between six members of the recreation department and the swimming pool staff, as they tug-of-warred across one end of the pool. It all ended when the latter group was pulled head-first into the water.

The pool staff drew about 500 persons to their "Wet Suite" water show at the pool last night.

A wide range of performances included synchronized swimming, skits and songs.

The show began with a synchronized duet by Janet Littleton and Linda Percy who swam elegantly to the song Impossible Dream.

A fable about rescue techniques, was performed by Rick Galasso, Bill Littleton, Beth Turner, Barb May, Pati Wigglesworth and Kathy Swanston. The fable was written by John Wilson.

A diving display was also performed which consisted of various diving techniques.

The senior synchronized group, with Patty Eagar, Janet Littleton, Linda Percy and Pat Turner, also performed in the pool. They swam to the tune That Barefoot Feeling. Kim Saunders and Cathy Olsen of the junior synchronized club performed a duet called the "Tijuana Sauerkraut."

A hilarious skit was acted out by the competitive swimming club which was followed by a skit by Jack Littleton and Gary Merritt called Emergency Procedures.

This was followed by a synchronized novelty duet with Brian Shackleton and Janet Littleton.

The show concluded with a short water play called "Maintenance Boys" by Jack and Janet Littleton, Ian McPhee, Bill Littleton, Kathy Swanston and Darlene and Patty Eagar.
